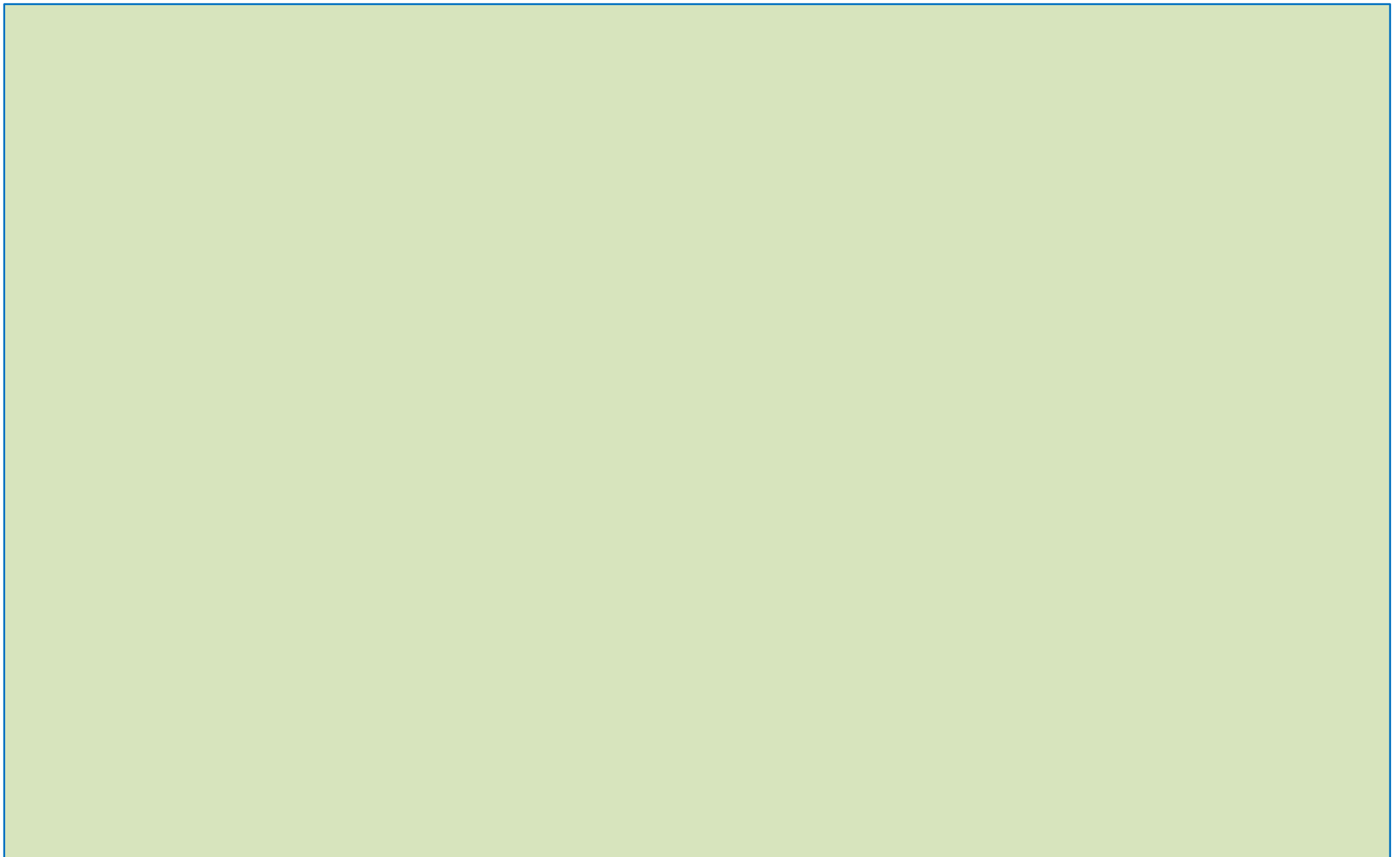

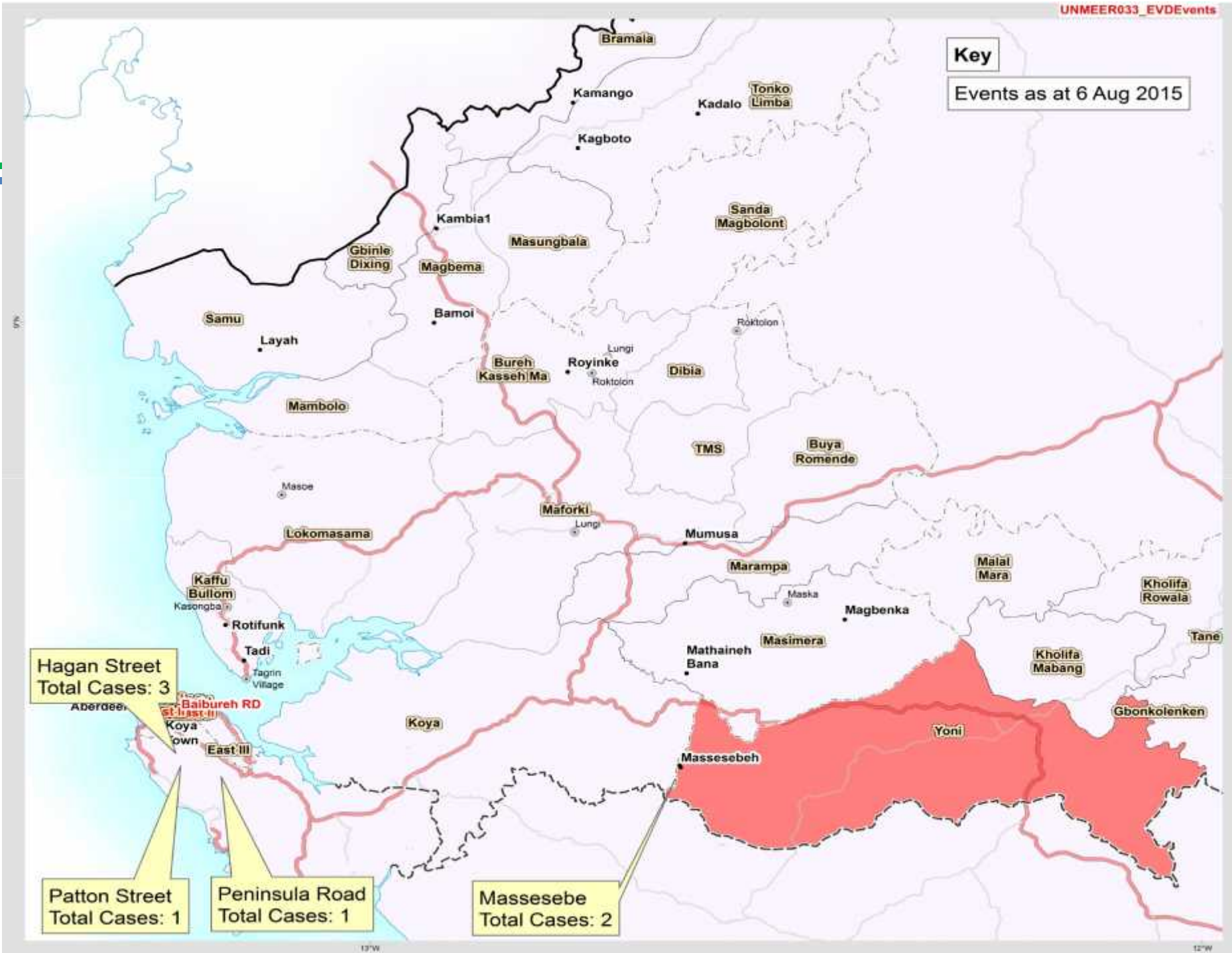

TONK001 – Update 8

Headlines: 3 x quarantined guests that were transferred to IMC TU after showing symptomatic signs have had a second EVD- test result. They will be transferred back to Massessebeh village into a new high-risk facility.

Background: MK a 28 yo male from Freetown travelled to Massessebeh on 17 Jul to celebrate Eid with his family. He started feeling ill and on 19 Jul and went to Yele Hospital where he sought medication. On 20 Jul his condition deteriorated and he was taken to Masanga Hosp by family members on 21 Jul and was admitted into the hospital. He died on 23 Jul. A swab test was taken and MK was found to have been EVD+ on 24 Jul, Massessebe village was subsequently placed into quarantine and a number of HcWs from Masanga Hosp were also quarantined on 25 Jul. 6 HcWs from Yele Hosp staff who are also being monitored but have not been quarantined. A missing Contact from Masanga Hospital was found on 27 Jul and taken to IMC TU and later tested EVD-. AS maternal uncle of index case tested EVD+ on 1 Aug and is now undergoing treatment at IMC TU. On 2 Aug AS Mother of index case and also from HR facility in Massessebe tested EVD+ and is now undergoing treatment at IMC TU.

UPDATE: The 3 x guests from the HR facility in Massessebeh village that MCD over last 72 hours and were transferred to the IMC TU have now had a second EVD- test result. They will now be removed from IMC TU and transferred back to the village into a another newly erected high risk facility, which has been prepared specifically for this eventuality.

Next 24 hours:

Operation Tonkolili Action Plan (90 day plan) will be delivered to the NERC by the DC on 6 Aug at the NERC.

The 2 x EVD+ guests from HR facility in the village now in the IMC TU will continue to receive treatment.

Continued monitoring by Psycho Soc and Soc Mob of guests quarantined in Masanga Hosp and Massessebeh village.

Tonkolili District - Update

- No new cases for 5 days
- 2 x contact from HR facility in Massessebeh previously to IMC are responding to treatment.
- A 4 year old girl from a low risk HHD in Massessebeh village was taken to IMC TU after vomiting and indicating a temperature of 40c. She is now undergoing assessment.
- Critical healthcare pathway put in place enabling 15 yo girl from Massessebeh village to safely give birth last week in Lion Heart hospital. Mother and Baby have been released after tested EVD negative.
- There are currently 26 patients in Masanga hospital that are still under quarantine. All are receiving medical care from MSF HcWs and are in good spirits
- 2 patients died from other causes (Not EVD related)
- High vigilance at both Massessebeh Village and Masanga hospital of quarantined contacts.
- Contact monitoring is robust, but UNPFA awaiting leadership support and essential supplies including rain gear.
- All support services for the guests are working well.
- Discussions ongoing with DERC and DMO for the re-opening of Masanga hospital post quarantine.

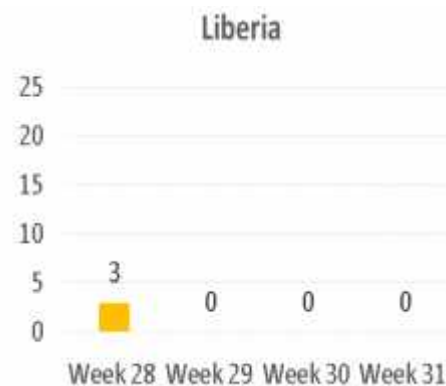
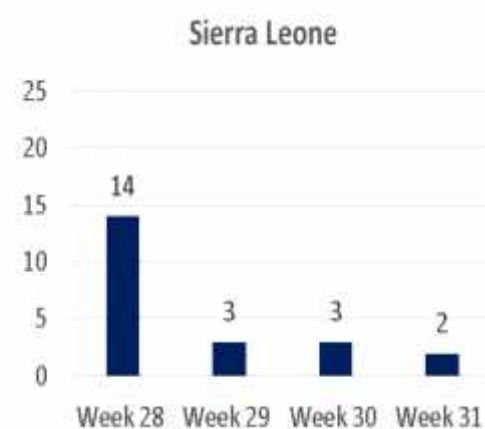
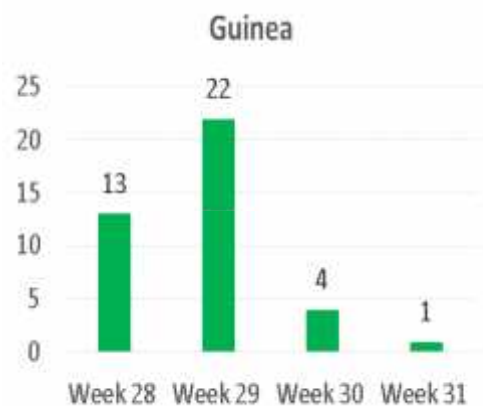

EBOLA SITUATION IN GUINEA, LIBERIA & SIERRA FROM MARCH 2014 INTO WEEK COMMENCING 27TH JULY 2015

The last two weeks have seen a systematic decrease in the number of confirmed EVD cases in the three countries. In week 31, there were only 3 confirmed cases; 1 in Conakry, Guinea and 2 in Tonkolili district, Sierra Leone marking the lowest weekly figure in the last 10 weeks. Liberia has not recorded a new EVD Case in the last 3 weeks. All 3 confirmed cases were on contact list, implying sustained surveillance activities in the 3 countries *(Source: WHO Ebola Situation Report – 5 August, 2015)*

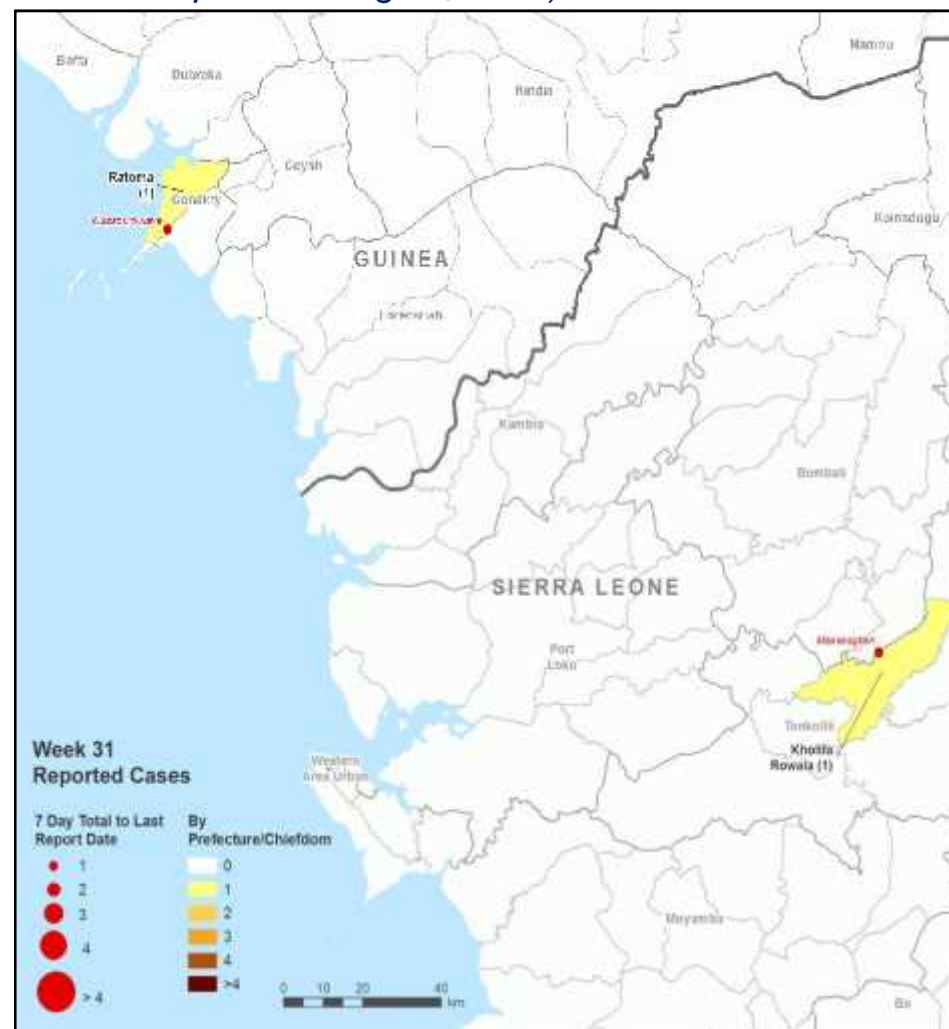
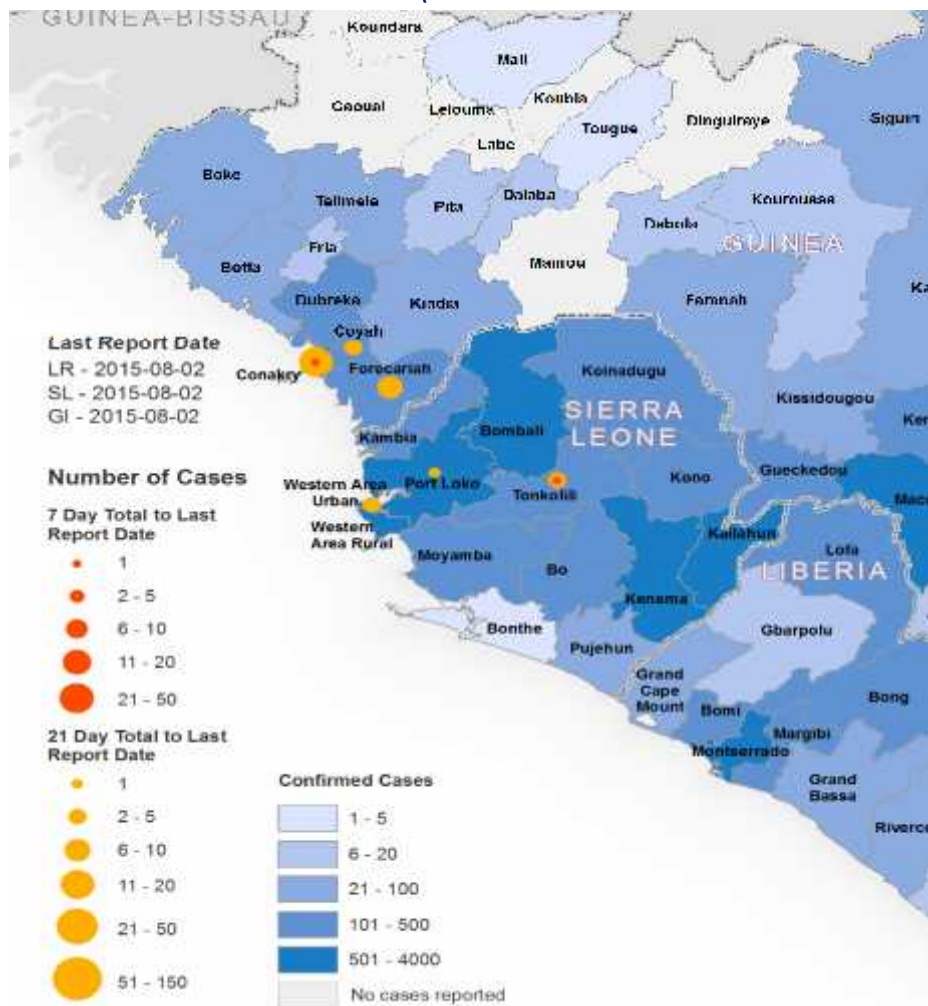


REGIONAL DASHBOARD - EBOLA SITUATION & CONTROL IN GUINEA, LIBERIA & SIERRA

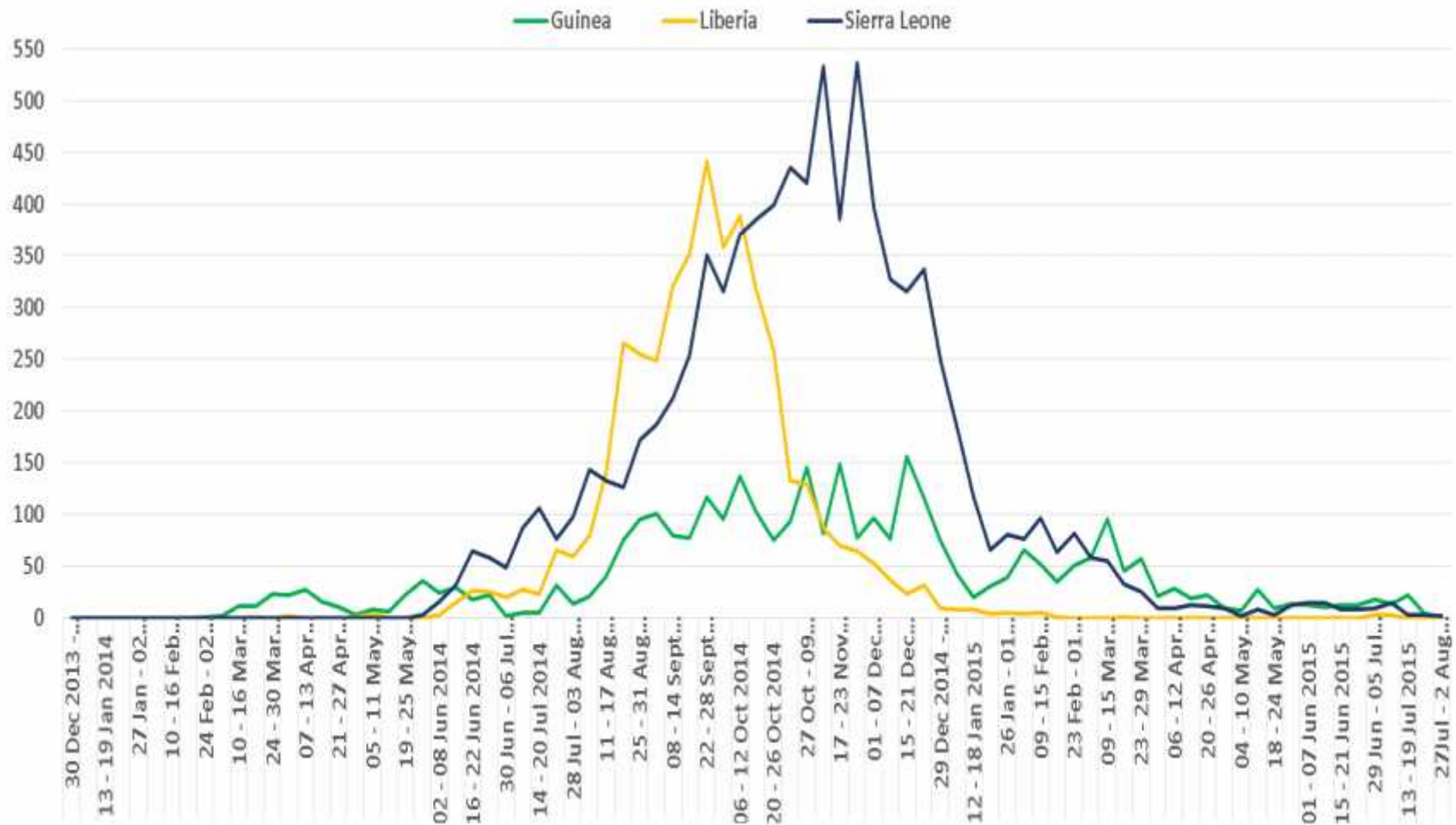

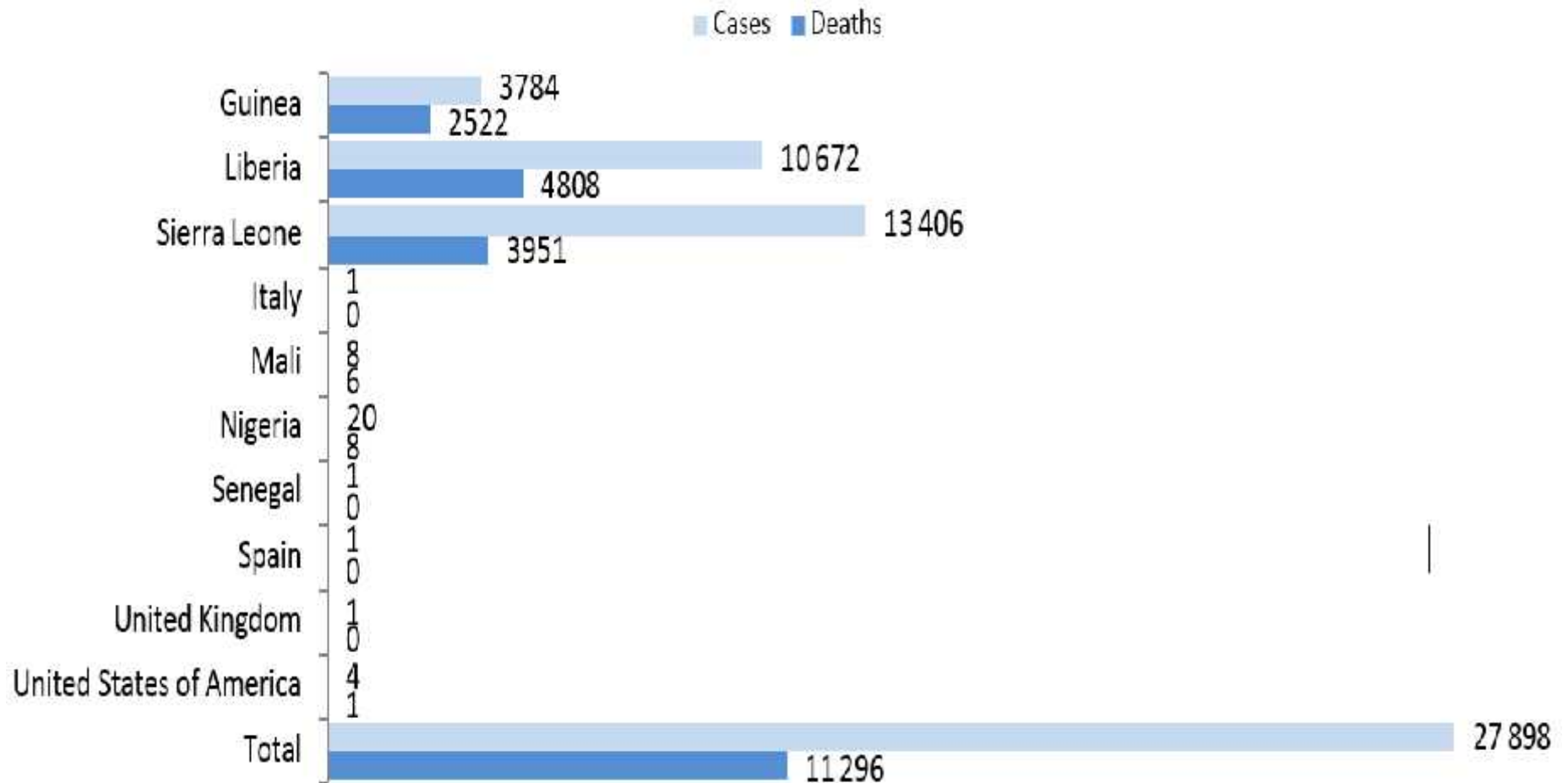
Confirmed Ebola Cases Nationally & Internationally (WHO Ebola Situation Report – 5 August, 2015)



EBOLA SITUATION IN GUINEA, LIBERIA & SIERRA FROM MARCH 2014 INTO WEEK COMMENCING 27TH JULY 2015

A total of 880 confirmed health care infections have been reported from Guinea, Liberia and Sierra Leone since the start of the outbreak, with 512 deaths. For week 31, for the first time in 3 weeks, no new health worker infections were reported from any of the 3 affected countries.

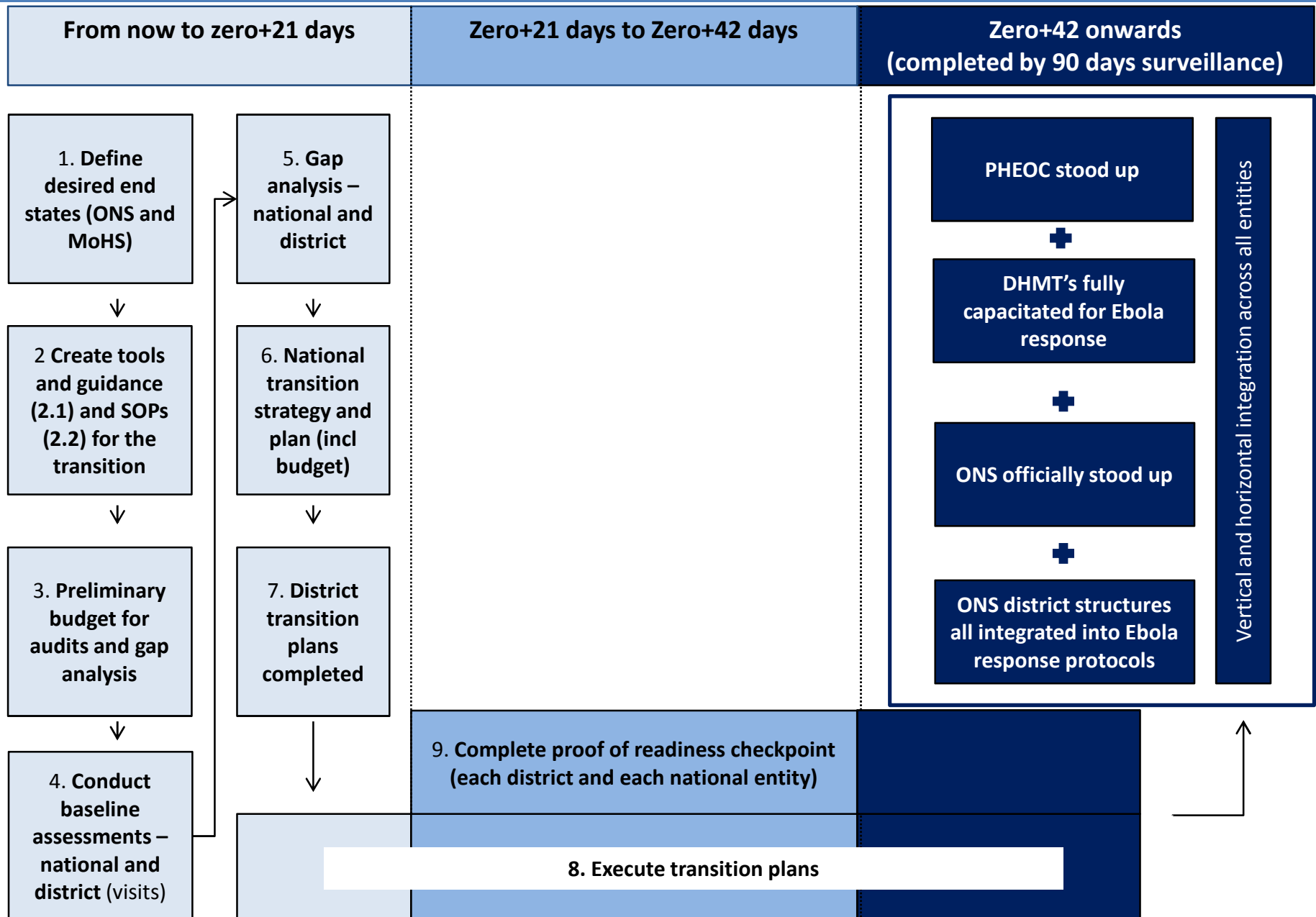

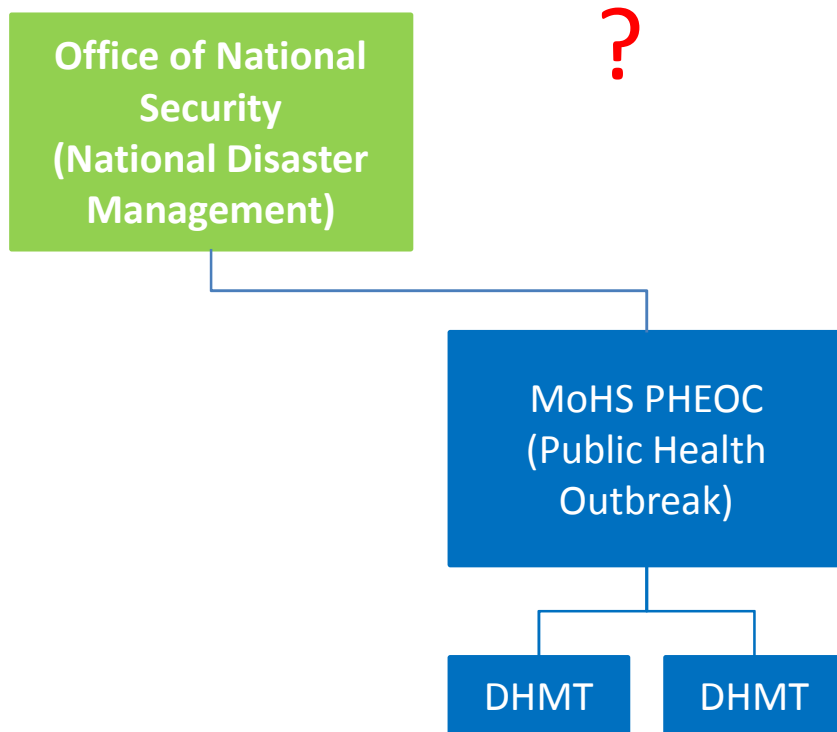


Transition Approach – How to transition from Ebola to Resilient Disaster Management & Healthcare Structures

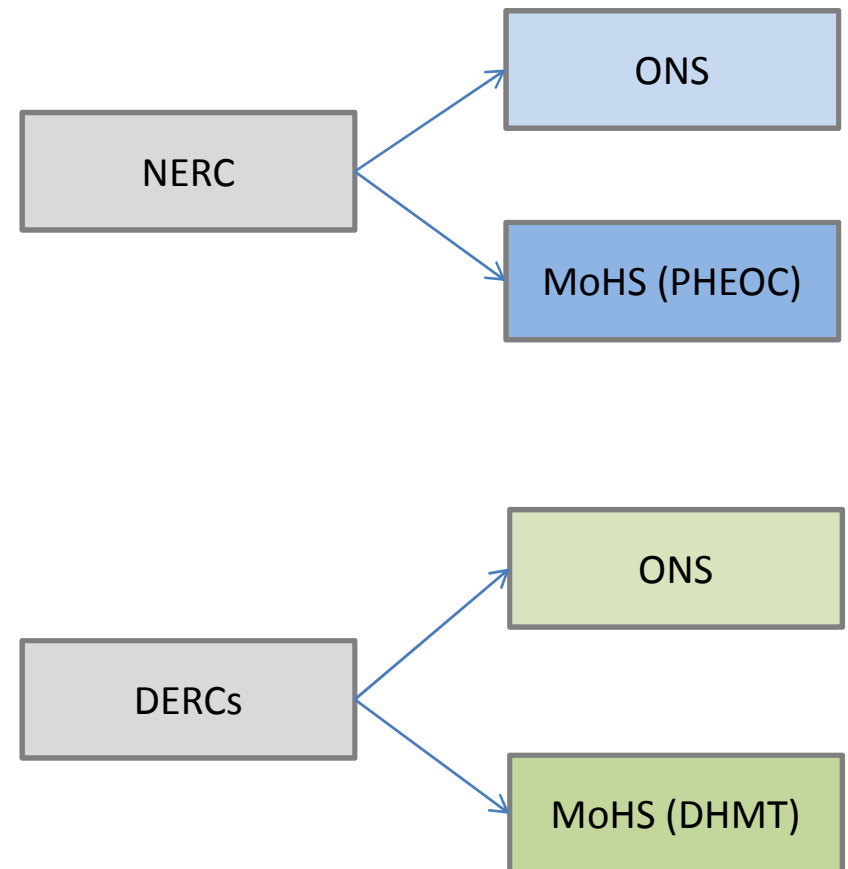


Framing of the Future State of Disaster Management

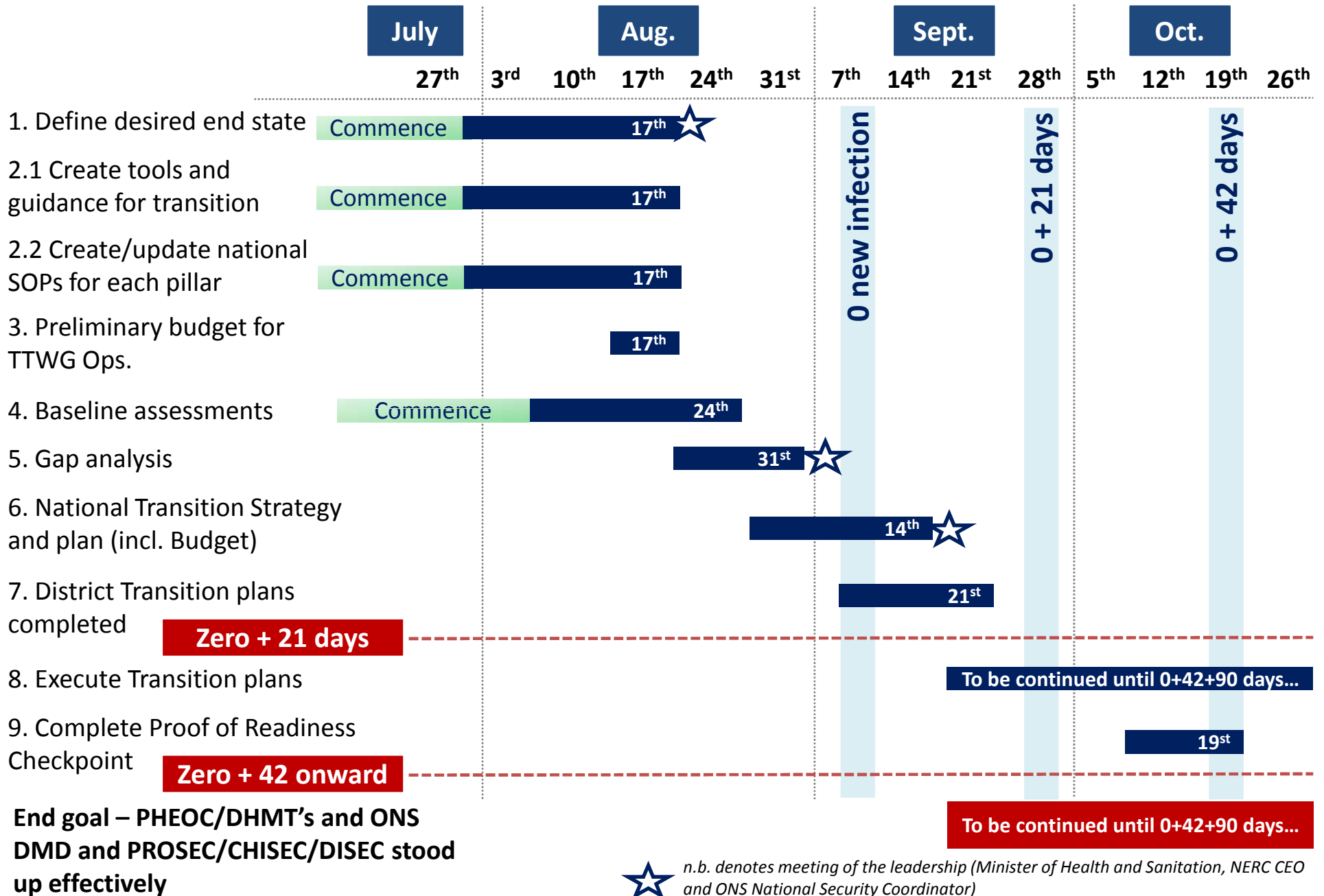
National Disaster Management Architecture..

What are the risks and challenges?

1. Slow progress in bringing PHEOC/ONS up-to-speed
2. Harmonized partner support around shared vision
3. How confident are we in capacity and readiness of MoHS/PHEOC/ONS to stand up when (not if) there is another outbreak (in next 12-24 months)?
4. How do we retain NERC/DERCs response capability without providing clarity on its future?
5. How will we "build back better" without learning lessons?

- **Green light for lesson learning exercise**

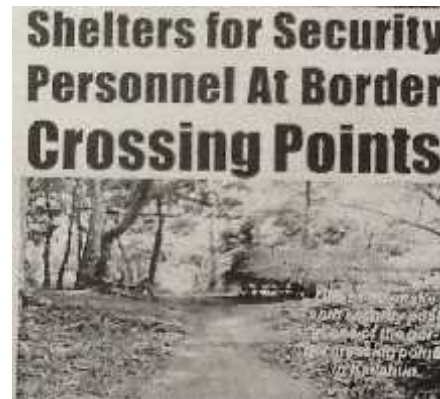
